


Motorcycles in Ohio

OHIO CRASHES

- There were 165 motorcycle-related fatalities in Ohio in 2012, 5 fewer than the 170 killed in 2011. This amounts to a drop of 3%. Just 5 years ago, in 2008, 215 people died in motorcycle-related crashes.
- From 2010 to 2012, motorcycle-involved crashes resulted in a total of 509 fatalities and 11,480 injuries statewide.
- From 2010-2012, motorcycle drivers were at-fault in 54% of all motorcycle-related crashes. For fatal crashes, the number rose to 71%. In 48% of motorcycle-related fatal crashes, the motorcycle was the only vehicle involved.
- Fifty percent (50%) of motorcycle-related fatal crashes from 2010-2012 were alcohol- and/or drug-related.

OSHP CITATIONS*

- OSHP troopers wrote 8,571 citations to motorcyclists from 2010-2012 (see map above). This is an increase of two percent (+2%) over the previous three-year period (2007-2009).
- Citations for driving a motorcycle without an appropriate operator license or endorsement decreased by 3% between 2007-2009 and 2010-2012. These violations accounted for one in five (20%) motorcyclist citations.
- Forty-six percent (46%) of motorcyclist citations included speeding violations during 2010-2012. Compared to 2007-2009, speed citations increased 10%. Nine percent (9%) of motorcyclist citations included an OVI citation.

OHIO MOTORCYCLE REGISTRATIONS‡

- A total of 421,510 motorcycles were registered in Ohio in 2012. This is 3% higher than the number of registrations in 2011 and 13% higher than 2007 levels.
