


## Speed-Related Crashes and Arrests

### Speed-Related Crashes

- In 2011, 124,948 crashes in Ohio were caused by speed-related\* factors, accounting for 30% of fatal crashes, 47% of injury crashes and 42% of crashes overall. Speed-related crashes killed 479 people and injured 72,536 in 2011.
- Speed-related factors were the leading cause of fatal crashes in 2011, followed by Improper Lane Change/Drove Off Road/Improper Passing (13%), Left of Center (11%) and Failure to Yield (10%).
- Young drivers represent the highest percentage of speed-related crashes. Drivers age 16-20 caused 21% of all speed-related crashes while drivers age 21-25 caused another 16%.

### Speeding Citations

- In 2011, OSHP officers wrote 289,554 citations that included a speed violation. Fifty-six percent of all citations written by troopers included a speed violation.
- Eighty-one percent of motorists cited for a speed violation were traveling 10-20 miles per hour over the speed limit. Most commonly, tickets were issued to drivers traveling 80 mph in a 65 mph zone.
- Younger drivers receive the most speeding citations. Drivers age 16-25 accounted for 29% of all speed violations, while drivers age 25-36 received another 24%. Male drivers were the offenders in 62% of speed violations.

\*Speed-related causes include "exceeded speed limit," "unsafe speed," "followed to closely/ACDA" and "failure to control."
