Patrol seizes 95 pounds of marijuana, valued at approximately \$215,000 in Hancock County traffic stop

FINDLAY – Two men will be arraigned in Findlay Municipal Court on felony drug charges after Ohio State Highway Patrol troopers seized 95 pounds of marijuana, valued at approximately \$215,000, during a traffic stop early Sunday in Hancock County.

The driver, Gabino Reyes-Serna, 43, of Mexico, and passenger, Oscar Campos, 44, of Weslaco, TX, were charged with aggravated possession of marijuana, and aggravated trafficking, both second-degree felonies, and possession of criminal tools, a fifth-degree felony. Reyes-Serna was also charged with identity theft, a fifth-degree felony.

Troopers stopped a 1997 Mercury Mountaineer, with Texas registration, for a failure to yield violation, on the off-ramp to county road 99 off Interstate 75 at approximately 12:24 a.m. yesterday. Troopers observed criminal indicators and a Hancock County Sheriff's Office drug-sniffing canine alerted to the vehicle. A probable cause search revealed 95 pounds of marijuana.

The suspects were incarcerated in the Hancock County Jail. If convicted, Reyes-Serna could face up to 18 years in prison and a \$35,000 fine. Campos could face up to 17 years in prison and a \$32,500 fine.
