Sergeant Norris to serve as Patrol spokesperson

COLUMBUS- Sergeant Max B. Norris II of the Ohio State Highway Patrol's Athens Post has transferred to the Public Affairs Unit as part of a six-month program, in which he will temporarily serve as a spokesperson for the Patrol.

Sgt. Norris joined the Patrol in May 1993 as a member of the 125th Academy Class. He was commissioned that November and assigned to the Jackson Post, where in 1996 and 1998 he was named Post Trooper of the Year by his peers. He was promoted to the rank of sergeant in August 2001 and transferred to the Athens Post, to serve as an assistant post commander.

Sgt. Norris also served temporary assignments as a salvage inspector in 1996, an instructor at the Academy in 2000 and an investigator in the Administrative Investigations Unit in 2009.

Sgt. Norris earned an Associate of Arts degree in Communication from the University of Rio Grande in May 1989 and an Associate of Applied Science degree from the Cincinnati College of Mortuary Sciences in October 1990.

Sgt. Norris currently resides in Albany with his wife, Annaliese, and their son, Colin.
