


## STATEWIDE REPORTED TRAFFIC FATALITIES 01/01/2008 – 03/23/2008



### SIGNIFICANT HIGHWAY PATROL APPREHENSIONS

03/10/2008 – 03/23/2008

Trooper March Trooper Vollmer Columbus PD Narcotics United States DEA	DEA Agents contacted the Patrol and requested assistance in locating a vehicle driven by a suspected drug courier. Trooper March was dispatched to I71 in Columbus and observed the suspect vehicle making several marked lane violations. Criminal indicators led to a PC search by a Columbus PD K-9 Unit. Positive alerts revealed a large cache of US currency concealed in a hidden compartment in the vehicle. Further investigation by the DEA and Columbus PD led to a search warrant for a Pataskala residence. Items seized include \$3.1 million in US currency, 2,100 lbs. of marijuana, and 71 firearms.
Trooper Baranowski Trooper Alexander Trooper Demuth	The Patrol's Automatic License Plate Reader (APR) on the Ohio Turnpike alerted to a 2007 Pontiac Grand Prix that was reported stolen out of Wisconsin. Troopers intercepted the vehicle and attempted to make a traffic stop. A short pursuit ensued with the suspect exiting the Turnpike and crashing through a toll gate near SR 109 in Fulton County. Troopers successfully deployed stop sticks that slowed the vehicle. The suspect traveled another 1/2 mile before bringing the vehicle to a stop. Upon approach, Troopers discovered that the suspect was deceased from a self-inflicted knife wound to the neck. The suspect was wanted for an active felony warrant for escape.




### SIGNIFICANT HIGHWAY PATROL STOLEN VEHICLE RECOVERIES<sup>1</sup>

<b>OSHP</b> Trooper Davis  <b>Troy PD</b> US Marshals US Secret Service	The Piqua Post received a call from the US Marshals about a 2007 Chrysler 300 that was traveling on I75 in Miami County. The driver of the suspect vehicle had multiple felony warrants for fraud and identity theft through Sylvania Township PD and the state of Michigan. Trooper Davis made contact with the vehicle and initiated a felony traffic stop. The suspect identified himself as Willie S. Clark III. A search of the vehicle revealed blank payroll check paper, a new scanner, a new cell phone and blackberry, and a forged payroll check made out to Willie Clark. The US Marshals arrived on scene and identified the suspect as Jermaine Knowles. Contact was made with the US Secret Service regarding the fraudulent payroll checks.
<b>OSHP</b> Trooper Smart Trooper Simms Trooper Barrett  <b>Preble CSO</b> Deputy Matt Lusford	Trooper Smart stopped a 2008 Subaru Legacy with Illinois plates on I70 in Preble County for an unsafe lane change and traveling at an extremely high rate of speed. Upon approach, the two male juveniles refused to exit the vehicle and fled the scene. A six-mile pursuit ensued with the suspect vehicle traveling in excess of 130mph. The suspects were able to avoid road spikes that were deployed by Trooper Simms and eventually pulled off the road into a rest area and fled on foot. With the assistance of the Preble CSO, a perimeter was set and the suspects were subsequently apprehended at gunpoint. The vehicle was reported stolen from the Oshkosh, Wisconsin PD.
