


## STATEWIDE REPORTED TRAFFIC FATALITIES 01/01/2008 – 07/20/2008



### SIGNIFICANT HIGHWAY PATROL APPREHENSIONS

07/07/2008 – 07/20/2008

OSHP Post 21 OSHP Aviation Delaware CSO Columbus PD Westerville PD Genoa PD	The Delaware Post received several calls over the past few weeks related to drag racing on I71 in Franklin County. An initiative was coordinated with local authorities and patrol personnel to intercept the vehicles. Shortly after midnight on 7/12/2008, a group of 15 to 20 suspect vehicles were observed leaving a designated gathering spot and headed to I71. OSHP aviation personnel observed multiple vehicles stop traffic in all 3 NB interstate lanes and allow other vehicles to race. The location of the vehicles were sent to ground units that were strategically placed along exit ramps to intercept the suspects. A total of eight vehicles were stopped and suspects arrested.
Trooper Ceullar	Trooper Ceullar observed a vehicle stopped along RR tracks near CR9 in Williams County. Upon approach the vehicle fled and was stopped a short time later for driving left of center. During questioning, the driver admitted that he was waiting for a train to come because he wanted to kill himself. The Trooper called for a psychiatric evaluation and the suspect was found to be depressed and experiencing audio and visual hallucinations, including hearing voices that told him to harm himself. The driver was committed to the Coping Center in Defiance Hospital.






\*Data includes assault cases on state-owned property near roads (e.g., rest areas). Assaults that occur in state institutions (e.g., prisons) or cases involving resisting arrest are not included. Does not include cases of vehicular homicide/assault unless the suspect intended to cause bodily harm against another person.

### OSHP ASSAULT CASES

- From January-June 2008, OSHP Troopers have initiated 156 cases involving assaults that occurred on or near Ohio roads.
- OSHP District 3 accounted for the largest number of roadway assault cases (25 or 16%).
- At the County-level, Medina and Stark have recorded the most assault cases (9 each), followed by Lorain (8), Mahoning (8), and Portage (7). These five counties accounted for over one in four OSHP assault cases on Ohio roads (41 or 26%).
- Overall, roadway assault cases were initiated by the Patrol in 58 or 66% of Ohio Counties.
- Roadway assaults occurred most frequently on Thursdays (20%). Forty percent of cases occurred between the hours of 4:00pm-10:00pm.
