



INTERSTATE SPEED: % OF VEHICLES TRAVELING OVER 75 MPH*



WEEKLY FOCUS: INTERSTATE SPEEDS

- Ohio Interstate Routes cover a combined 6,535 lane miles across the state, supporting over 80 million vehicle miles traveled annually.¹
- On six segments of Ohio interstates for which data are available, over 14% of vehicles averaged 75 mph or greater in January-March 2006.² They include IR70 in Clark and Madison counties; IR71 in Warren county; IR77 in Noble county; IR80 in Mahoning county; and IR90 in Ashtabula county.
- Approximately 14% of all fatal crashes and 10% of all injury crashes in Ohio occur on Interstate Routes. The majority (69%) of those crashes are caused by speeding.
- Speed-related fatal crashes increased in 2005 compared to 2004, reversing a previous downward trend. In January-March 2006, the proportion of speed-related fatal crashes decreased slightly (when compared to the same time period in 2005).
