







Average Annual Fatal and Injury Crashes per 100 Million VMT Caused by Red Light Running*



- Red light runners caused 241 fatal crashes and 17,811 injury crashes from 2004 to 2006.*
- Crashes caused by red light runners tend to be more severe compared to other crash causes, with 42% of those crashes resulting in injury or fatality. The only crash cause that produced a higher proportion of injury or fatal crashes from 2004 to 2006 was driver fatigue/sleeping.
- Drivers age 16 to 25 were at fault in one-third (34%) of fatal and injury crashes caused by red light running. This particular driver error was attributed more frequently to younger drivers, and was progressively less common among older drivers.
- Half (50%) of fatal and injury crashes caused by red light running took place during the afternoon hours, from noon to 6:00 p.m.
- Nearly one-quarter (23%) of red light runners in fatal crashes were alcohol- or drug-impaired.
- Thirteen Ohio counties averaged over 20 fatal or injury crashes per 100 million vehicle miles traveled (VMT) each year caused by red light running (see map).

* "Red light running" is used to refer to running either red lights or stop signs; "VMT" = Vehicle Miles Traveled.
