









- Nationwide, there are about 500,000 deer crashes every year, resulting in approximately 150-200 fatalities, 29,000 injuries, and \$1 billion in property damage.¹ Ohio is among the top states, in terms of number of deer crashes each year, with nearly 90,000 reported from 2004 to 2006.
- Half (50%) of all Ohio deer crashes from 2004 to 2006 occurred in October, November, and December. More than one in five (23%) took place in November alone. Counties reporting the highest number of deer crashes from October-December 2006 include Hamilton (353), Richland (342), Knox (316), Summit (297), and Delaware (281). See map above.
- From 2004 to 2006, nearly two-thirds (62%) of deer crashes took place *at night* on *unlit roadways*. The majority (83%) of the crashes were on dry roads (15% on wet roads; 1% on snow/ice).
- In 2006, there were 12 fatalities resulting from deer crashes (71% increase compared to the previous 3-year average). Ten of the twelve fatalities (83%) were motorcyclists. In the last 3 years, nearly three-quarters (74%) of all deer crash fatalities were motorcyclists.
