






▲ Triple Fatality Crash (2)

★ Single Fatality Crash (50)





## WORK ZONES

2006 Fatal and Injury Work Zone Crashes  
(Number/Percent of all Fatal & Injury Crashes)



- Counties having the highest proportion of fatal and injury crashes in work zones in 2006 occurring in work zones include Madison (9.3%); Medina (4.9%); Sandusky (4.7%); Preble (4.5%); and Stark (3.8%).

- 13 counties had no fatal or injury crashes in work zones in 2006.

### 2007 National Work Zone Awareness Week is April 2-6

- There were a total of 5,739 crashes in work zones on Ohio roads in 2006. Of those crashes, 19 (less than one percent) were fatal and 1,394 (25%) involved injuries.
- Work crews were present in the work zones for more than one-third (36%) of the crashes.
- Thirty-two percent (32%) of fatal crashes, 18% of injury crashes, and 25% of property-damage-only crashes in work zones in 2006 involved commercial vehicles.
- Three in five (60%) work zone crashes in 2006 took place in daylight and on dry roads.
- Following too closely, or failing to maintain "assured clear distance ahead" (ACDA) was the single most common cause of 2006 work zone crashes (36% of at-fault drivers).
